FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



What is Jamiatul Hind Al Islamiyya?

Jamiatul Hind Al Islamiyya is the largest affiliating Islamic university in India under the auspices of Samastha Kerala Jamiatul Ulama. With over 300 affiliated institutions, a student body exceeding 10,000, an alumni network of 4,000 graduates, and more than 2,000 faculty members, the university plays a significant role in higher Islamic education. Additionally, Jamiatul Hind has published over 40 scholarly works and has produced more than 3,000 Hadi and Muhtadi graduates serving in Kerala and beyond.



What is the Jamiatul Hind Single Window System?

The Jamiatul Hind Single Window System facilitates a streamlined admission process for students enrolling in grades 8 and 11 across the university's affiliated institutions. Prospective students may apply online through a unified application and participate in a standardized admission examination. The selection process includes a written examination and an interview. Based on the merit list, students will be

allotted seats in their preferred institutions through a phased process comprising first, second, and spot allotments.

 **How does the Jamiatul Hind Single Window System compare to conventional single-window admission systems?**

The Single Window System at Jamiatul Hind operates similarly to commonly recognized centralized admission systems, wherein students select their preferred institutions. Admission is granted based on merit, determined by the entrance examination and ranking system. The system follows a methodology comparable to national-level entrance examinations such as NEET and KEAM.

 **How can one apply for the entrance examination (J-SAT)?**

Admissions are determined through the Jamiatul Hind Scholastic Aptitude Test (J-SAT). Applications for J-SAT can be submitted online via the official university website: www.jamiathulhind.com.

 **Is there an age limit for the entrance examination? Who is eligible to apply?**

Yes, there are age restrictions for applicants. The upper age limit for admission is fifteen years for grade 8 and eighteen years for grade 11. Students exceeding this age bracket may seek admission through special arrangements by contacting the Jamiatul Hind administrative office directly. Eligibility for application requires successful completion of grade 7 for entry into grade 8 and grade 10 for entry into grade 11.

 **Are academic programs available for female students?**

Currently, admissions through the Single Window System are open exclusively to Muslim male students. The courses offered are fully residential pro-

grams.

What courses are offered by Jamiatul Hind?

Jamiatul Hind provides innovative academic programs that integrate rigorous Islamic studies with general education. The available courses include:

- Foundational & Intermediate Programs
- Bachelor's Programs
- Master's Programs
- Research Programs and Projects
- Advanced Postgraduate Diploma Courses
- Short-term Courses and Certificate Programs

The syllabus for these programs is available on the official website of Jamiatul Hind.

What courses are available for students who have completed grade 7?

Students who have completed grade 7 can pursue an integrated academic and religious education, enabling them to study up to the Plus Two (higher secondary) level, undergraduate (degree), postgraduate (PG), and doctoral (PhD) programs. Additionally, they will receive traditional Islamic education from the Foundation level to Muthawal (postgraduate level) and beyond.

What academic opportunities are available for students who have completed grade 10?

Students who have completed grade 10 can progress through Plus Two, undergraduate (degree), postgraduate (PG), and doctoral (PhD) studies. They also have the opportunity to engage in traditional Islamic education from the Foundation level to Muthawal (postgraduate level), with further specialization options.

What is the format and methodology of the entrance examination?

Admission to Jamiatul Hind institutions is based on performance in the J-SAT entrance examination. The structure of the examination is as follows:

- 75% of the questions will be from the school curriculum.
- 25% of the questions will be from Islamic studies.
- A model question paper is available on the Jamiatul Hind website.
- Jamiatul Hind will determine the format, difficulty level, and examination content.
- The entrance examination and interview will be conducted at designated centres, which applicants must select at the time of application.

What are the key instructions for the examination?

Applicants must adhere strictly to the following guidelines:

- Arrive at the examination centre at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time.
- Candidates arriving more than one hour after the commencement of the examination will not be permitted to enter.
- Students may leave the examination hall only after one hour from the start of the examination.
- The examination will consist of 100 objective-type questions.
- Answers must be recorded on the OMR sheet. Candidates are advised to familiarize themselves with its usage beforehand.
- Three questions will require written responses, for which answer sheets will be provided by

Jamiatul Hind.

- Only blue or black pens are permitted; candidates must bring their pens.
- A printed hall ticket is mandatory for entry into the examination hall and participation in the interview.
- Candidates may only bring a pen, a regular wristwatch, and their hall ticket. Electronic devices such as calculators and mobile phones are strictly prohibited.
- During the interview, candidates must present original documents, including mark sheets, certificates for Hifz (Qur'anic memorization), and achievements in Jamia Mahrajan, SSF Literary Festival, IAME Fest, school cultural festivals, and scholarship records.
- The interview will primarily assess reading ability and additional skills.
- Further details regarding the examination and interview will be communicated through the online portal. Candidates are advised to stay informed and comply with all instructions.



When does the application process begin, and what is the deadline?

The online application period will commence on March 20, 2025, and conclude on April 18, 2025.



What factors should be considered when selecting an institution?

Choosing an institution is a crucial decision that should be made carefully. Students and parents should take into account various aspects such as course structure, faculty expertise, campus facilities, residential amenities, and institutional regulations. Since each institution may have distinct teaching methodologies

and priorities, applicants must conduct thorough research before making their final decision. It is important to note that complaints regarding academic programs and facilities due to lack of prior investigation will not be entertained by the Jamiatul Hind administration. Therefore, prospective students are strongly advised to make well-informed choices.

Can individuals who do not meet the prescribed eligibility criteria apply to Jami'atul Hind?

Applicants who do not meet the specified qualifications may directly contact Jami'atul Hind for further guidance and assistance.

How is the allotment process conducted?

The admission process consists of three phases: first allotment, second allotment, and spot allotment. The allotment results will be made available through the online portal on the designated dates. Students who are unable to attend the spot allotment may seek admission through the Jami'atul Hind office, subject to seat availability. Additionally, students allocated a seat in the first round may opt for a different institution in the second allotment. However, rejection of the second allotment is not permitted.

What is spot allotment?

Spot allotment is a process wherein applicants can secure admission by visiting the designated centre, as specified by Jami'atul Hind, with their hall ticket. This option is available for students who were unable to obtain a seat during the first and second allotments. Seats are allocated based on vacancy, following a first-come, first-served principle.

What is the procedure for admission?

Students who secure a seat through the allotment process must visit the assigned institution along with

their guardian to complete the admission formalities. It is imperative to adhere strictly to the prescribed schedule. The list of required documents for admission will be communicated via the online portal.



How does the institution selection process work?

Applicants may select up to ten preferred institutions. The first preference should be the institution where the student wishes to enrol primarily. If admission is not secured there, the second preferred institution will be considered, followed by subsequent preferences in order. Admission is granted based on rank. If an applicant is not allocated a seat in any of the selected institutions during the first round, they may receive an allotment in the second round or through spot admission.



Is admission guaranteed for all applicants?

While Jami'atul Hind is committed to facilitating religious education and ensuring access to learning, seat allocation is subject to availability. Extensive efforts have been undertaken by the Kerala Muslim Jamaat to accommodate as many applicants as possible.



Can applicants modify their selected institutions after submission?

No, applicants cannot alter their selected institutions after submission. However, students may opt for a different institution during the second allotment if they receive an allotment in the first round. Rejection of the second allotment is not permitted. Applicants are therefore advised to carefully select their preferences.



How many institutions are affiliated with Jami'atul Hind? Is admission conducted through a centralized system?

Jami'atul Hind oversees more than 300 affiliated in-

stitutions. Admissions to all these institutions are processed through a unified single-window system.


 **Are all major institutions in Kerala affiliated with Jami'atul Hind?**

Yes, Jami'atul Hind includes several prominent institutions across Kerala. The complete list of affiliated institutions is available on the official Jami'atul Hind website.

 **How can a student secure admission under the management quota?**

Each institution reserves a certain percentage of seats under the management quota. Students seeking admission through this category must contact the respective institution before the written examination.

Admission under the management quota requires applicants to apply through the single-window system and appear for the J-SAT examination. Each institution may have specific criteria for admission under this category.

 **Can a student reject the institution allotted in the first round and opt for another institution in the second allotment?**

Yes. Students will be given a designated period after the first allotment to make this change.

 **Is it possible to reject the institution allotted in the second round and opt for another institution during spot allotment?**

No. Once a student is allotted an institution in the second round, it is mandatory to accept the seat and complete the admission process.

 **What options are available for students who cannot appear for the examination or do not secure a seat through spot allotment?**

Students who are unable to attend the examination or do not receive an allotment through the spot admission process may contact the Jami'atul Hind office directly for further assistance.



How can students find detailed information about their preferred institutions?

Comprehensive details about all affiliated institutions are available on the official website: www.jamiatulhind.com. However, students are encouraged to visit their preferred institutions personally to assess the facilities and academic structure before making a final decision.



What are the distinctive features of the Jami'atul Hind academic system and its courses?

- Jami'atul Hind operates campuses within and beyond Kerala under the guidance of Samastha Kerala Jamiyathul Ulama.
- The institution directly oversees all academic aspects, including admissions, curriculum, and examinations.
- Each affiliated college follows an authentic and comprehensive syllabus for Islamic studies.
- The institution offers programs ranging from foundational Islamic courses to advanced research studies, with high fellowships available for research scholars.
- All educational programs are provided free of cost.
- Jami'atul Hind follows a unique model of integrated religious and secular education.
- Students who have completed grade 7 can pursue studies from grade 8 to PhD in both Islamic and academic disciplines.

- Students who have completed grade 10 can enrol in programs from higher secondary to Ph.D. in both disciplines.
- Admissions to foundational (eighth grade onwards) and intermediate (higher secondary onwards) programs are conducted through the single-window system, while direct admissions are available for postgraduate and research programs.
- Teaching is offered in multiple languages, including Malayalam, Arabic, Urdu, English, Hindi, Kannada, and Tamil, with additional opportunities for learning foreign languages.
- Specialized curricula and academic structures cater to students of varying educational backgrounds.
- The institution aims to cultivate global scholars through structured academic frameworks.
- Various extracurricular activities, leadership training, and creative development programs are integrated into campus life.
- Scholarships, research fellowships, and merit-cum-means financial assistance programs are available.
- Faculty development programs, student enrichment initiatives, advanced leadership training, and global language proficiency courses are regularly conducted.
- Students receive training for national and international academic competitions.
- The institution collaborates with national and international universities for academic exchanges and research projects.
- Special coaching is provided for civil service examinations, NET/JRF qualification, and higher

education opportunities in prestigious global institutions.

 **Where can students and parents obtain detailed information about admissions, allotments, and applications?**

All necessary details are provided on the official Jami'atul Hind website. Students and parents are strongly advised to review the information, available in English, Malayalam, and Kannada.

Is religious education mandatory for students enrolled at Jami'atul Hind?

Yes. The core objective of Jami'atul Hind is to impart in-depth religious education alongside advanced secular studies.

 **What will be the uniform for students?**

The uniform will be based on the traditional attire of Muslim religious scholars in the respective country. However, minor variations may exist depending on the institution.

 **Can a student transfer to another institution after the course has begun?**

Yes, students may request a transfer to another institution before the first semester examination, subject to specific conditions.
